University Studies at St Peter's College

In this program advanced Year 12 students will study a Theology subject onsite at the school which will contribute to their SACE and be accredited fully by the University. We have learned so much about Hellenistic Platonism and Jewish theology and have been challenged in our Greek language. Next year we are planning to read something else...

Library News

Clive Rodger Donation

A Milestone Morning Tea was held in the library on 9 November to celebrate the end of processing and cataloguing the large quantity of books donated by Clive Rodger in 2015. These books went towards developing the library as you know it today. While the original donation included approximately 70,000 books, after all the sorting and processing, 29,700 books have now been added to the library. Over the last 8 years, many volunteers have worked tirelessly performing various tasks such as sorting, cataloguing, and processing to ensure they are available to borrow. The Milestone Morning Tea acknowledged the work of all volunteers past and present, and we celebrated their accomplishments in completing this massive project. In 2024, many of the current volunteers will continue working in the library doing other tasks to support the library and its users.

St Barnabas Rare Books

We are happy to announce that the St Barnabas rare books collection has been relocated from Flinders University back to St Barnabas College. As background, the St Barnabas Collection was given to the Flinders University Library in 1986 when St Barnabas' Theological College was located in Belair. Many of the volumes were published before 1800, and the earliest book in the collection is a selection of the works of Lactantius, a 2nd century CE theologian and rhetorician, published in 1532. Also notable is a 1533 edition of the Works of Gregory the Great, which features pieces cut from a contemporary manuscript as endpapers. There are nearly 1300 titles in the collection.

A significant portion of the collection came from the library of the Right Rev'd Augustus Short, first Bishop of Adelaide (1847 - 1881). In 1881, the year of his retirement, he donated many of his books to two libraries, and others were added later by his family. One of these was the library of the then new St Barnabas' Theological College, established in 1881 in North Adelaide, and the other was the Theological and Ecclesiastical Library of the Diocese of Adelaide, in Leigh Street, which was set up for use of the clergy.

Now, the collection will live at St Barnabas College, and time will be spent assessing the items one by one. Before this, however, background work needs to be done to evaluate how the collection will be curated. In the meantime, it is lovely knowing that these books have come home again.

- The Gospel of Mark in an Era of Loneliness, a public lecture to be given by The Rev'd Dr Michael Trainor at the Cynthia Poulton Hall on **Thursday 29 February at 7 pm.**
- Creation and the Cross, a book by renowned theologian Elizabeth Johnson reading group led by Rev'd Canon Jenny Wilson and Rev'd Grant Moore on every second

- Wednesday of the month at 2pm in St Barnabas College, June-November, in person or on zoom.
- Theologian in Residence: The Rev'd Rachel Taber-Hamilton, indigenous North American theologian. Dates and more information to follow.
