Prepare for teaching:

Visit the new website <https://sbcc.edu.au/> and read the library information at the bottom of the [Staff page](#). Here you will find; Copyright Notices for scans and photocopies, information on choosing books for reading lists, how to connect students with their readings, how to search for resources along with borrowing information.

Request books be placed on Reserve

Search the UD Library Hub to ensure that the key resources are available for students.

Send a request to place items on Reserve, either for library use only or 7-day loan. Items might include required textbooks, high use items for your course or items not available electronically.

To send a request:

- Search the [UD Library Hub](#).
- Sign in to your UD Library Hub account to save items and create and save lists. To login, you will need [ARK login](#) credentials.
- From your search results, select the **Save** icon to add items to your Saved Items folder as you search.
- When finished, click **Saved Items** in the upper right corner to display the list.
- Click the **Email** icon. A **Share List** window appears.
- Share the list to library@sbcc.edu.au with a Subject and Message.



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Request a purchase:

If the library doesn't have a book which is required for your unit, please email the librarian in advance. Print copies can take up to 4 weeks to arrive. The library aims to purchase eBook versions of key texts if possible.

When setting the required textbook for a Unit, there are a few things to consider from the student's perspective:

- **Availability:** Can the library purchase an eBook copy, or is it only in print? Is the item already available in the catalogue? Required and the recommended readings should be available online. Please do not recommend books which are not available through the catalogue.
- **Access:** Is access available to a limited number of simultaneous users? Setting a textbook that is only available as a one user licence could impact student experience negatively.
- **Cost:** Is the item overly expensive? To purchase an eBook for the library can be very expensive, sometimes prohibitively so. In this case print copies may be purchased which could impact student access, especially if the course is online or an intensive.

Connecting students to their readings

Many resources are available electronically via the UD Library Hub. To connect students with these resources, the best practice is to link. A guide is available from the UD Library Hub <https://library.divinity.edu.au/library-hub-guide-linking-to-library-hub-resources.html>

NOTE REGARDING SCANS FOR STUDENTS

We no longer have access to the FLEX platform to connect students to scanned readings such as book chapters. A solution has been found.

Semester 2: A [Talis Aspire](#) subscription has been acquired by the University of Divinity to connect students with their readings. Talis Aspire works in a similar way to CSU Library's Leganto List and integrates with UD systems such as the UD Library Hub and ARK.

During Semester 2 we will begin to transition creating Reading Lists using Talis Aspire. Access to the editing and publishing interface of Talis Aspire is by invitation sent out from either

Request a Course Reserves List for your Unit

If needed, ask to have a Course Reserve resource list created for your unit. This can be accessed by students via a URL or the UD Library Hub.

This is helpful for first year students and in particular units such as Greek or Hebrew which might have books with many versions or difficult to search for titles.

Also, if there are journals you would like students to look at, or websites, these can also be added to the list.

Copyright

St Barnabas College has an active statutory education licence, enabling teaching staff to copy and share Copyrighted material with students under a fair dealing provision. This means, while we have a licence, educators can share content which would normally require permission from the Copyright owner, with students for the purposes of education, study or research.

Copyright Notices can be found on the Staff page of the College Website under “Connecting students to their readings” or in the library next to the photocopier.



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The College **does not have a Screenrights licence**. This means that lecturers cannot copy and communicate Copyrighted television and radio broadcasts for educational purposes. The best solution is to ensure that Zoom recordings are paused when playing videos in class, so the video is not recorded. Linking to videos is better than embedding them into PowerPoints.

Copyright Compliance

Below are some examples to help you decide whether you can share a text, chapter, article, image, or digital resource with students under Australian copyright law and licence terms.

Any Copyrighted material used (copies, images etc.), must have an SBC statutory licence and sources must be cited.

1. Is the material freely available or licence-free?

Open Access (OA) or CC-licensed material may be used with proper attribution.

2. Is the material electronically licensed through the UD Library Hub?

YES: Use permalinks; do not upload full PDFs.

3. Statutory Text and Artistic Works Licence

Allows limited copying: 1 chapter or 10%; 1 journal article.

4. Do you need more than the allowed amount?

Link instead, check copyright expiry, or seek permissions.

5. Do you have permission?

If permission has been obtained, use within terms.

5. Are you streaming a video during class?

St Barnabas College does not have a Screenrights licence. This means that if videos are being shown during a lecture, stop your recording. Restart the recording once the video has finished.

6. Is the resource text on a web page?

Place links to web documents in ARK.



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7. Was the material accessed from behind a paywall, or another institution's electronic resources?

Generally, it is not possible to share copies of print materials obtained from behind a paywall as this material is restricted for personal use and subject to the terms of use dictated by the provider. Always check the provider's terms of use.

Examples

Example 1 — Scanning a Chapter

Allowed: one chapter or 10% under statutory licence. Consider fair use.

Read "What is fair use" by the Australian Law Reform Commission, which states to consider the following when determining fair use:

- (1) The purpose and character of the use, including whether such use is of a commercial nature or is for non-profit educational purposes;
- (2) The nature of the copyrighted work.
- (3) The amount and substantiality of the portion used in relation to the copyrighted work as a whole; and
- (4) The effect of the use upon the potential market for or value of the copyrighted work.

The fact that a work is unpublished shall not itself bar a finding of fair use if such finding is made upon consideration of all the above factors.

Example 2 — eBook Reading

Use permalinks, not PDFs.

Example 3 — Multiple Journal Articles

Articles on same topic allowed; otherwise link.



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Example 4 — Sharing a Web Image

Check for Copyright licence or for copying permissions.

Example 5 — Whole Book Needed

Cannot copy entire copyrighted edition, link to eBook if available. Contact Katrina to see if an eBook can be purchased for institutional use. The library cannot purchase eBooks which are available to purchase for individual use because of the licencing conditions set by the supplier. Use public domain if available.

Borrowing and Obtaining a UD ID Card

All lecturing staff can borrow from the SBC library. Your account is created once your IT Systems Access Form has been processed, and an account is created by staff managing the University of Divinity Library.

Can I borrow books from another library?

Yes, University of Divinity current staff and students can borrow from other partner colleges in South Australia by visiting the library in person with your University of Divinity ID card.

St Barnabas College staff and students can borrow from the Adelaide Theological Library at Brooklyn Park and LOHE, the Australian Lutheran College library located at North Adelaide.

Search results will display **live data** for libraries that participate in the University's Shared Catalogue.

These libraries are listed on the left-hand side of the UD Library Hub menu bar. Tick the St Barnabas College library to see our holdings. Search multiple library holdings by ticking the Adelaide Theological Library.



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Libraries which contribute their data

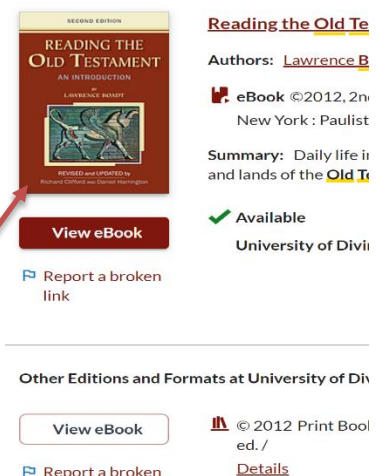
Search results will show holding information, but live data isn't available. Australian Lutheran College Library is one example.

To see the holdings of these libraries you need to:

1. Click on the item title you are interested in, then scroll down to Other Availability & Holdings
2. Click Other Libraries Worldwide button. This will bring up the holdings of the non-shared libraries.
3. Click on View Catalogue. This will take you to that library's holding.

Search for Ebooks using UD Library Hub

- Enter your search terms in the library catalogue.
Then use the limiters on the left hand side of the results screen.
Leave the tick on University of Divinity Libraries
Select ebook from the options under books
- How do I know if an ebook is available?
In your search results, the item record must contain the **red text box stating View eBook**

There are several ways of finding specific Journals.

- **Option 1:** use the Journals option under Find & Access
Use Limiters on left side of the catalogue: Tick University of Divinity Libraries.
Tick Libraries Worldwide and use Open Access or Full Text
- **Option 2:** Use the A-Z Journals List found under the resources tab or in the list at the bottom of the screen <http://divinity.on.worldcat.org/atoztitles>
2nd Option is specific. Use full title or ISSN not just keywords
This option will tell you, which database the journal is located and the coverage information.
- **Option 3:** Search specific databases. A full list of electronic databases to which the University of Divinity subscribes can be found here <https://divinity.libguides.com/az.php>

A Note about EBSCO Atla Religion Database

UD Library Hub will search all databases available to the University of Divinity, however results cannot be limited to ATLA (EBSCO Host) To search ATLA select the button at the bottom of the screen. Don't forget the full-text option once you begin searching ATLA.
